In Annakala's community, many people prefer traditional healers to address their medical problems—Annakala decided to do the same. However, she still suffered after the visit. Her daughter-in-law, on seeing her in pain and suspectina that it might be due to leprosy, encouraged Annakala to visit the Presbyterian World Service & Development-supported Shining Hospital. Once she was admitted to the hospital, she was officially diagnosed with leprosy and started treatment, which has improved her symptoms and pain. Annakala is very grateful for the Shining Hospital's care, love and support.

The Sugar Baron's Daughters – by Lisa T. Bergren

Book 3: Selah

The third book in this series is as exciting as the first two. Selah is the youngest of the three sisters, and is gentle by nature, but living on the Island of Nevis, in the West Indies, on a sugar plantation is inclined to harden a person as a necessity. It is a hard life, of hard work, in a situation where women have their place – and it isn't as plantation owners, and it isn't as people who help their slaves to obtain their freedom, and then hire them as actual farm hands.

Selah works well with the hired hands on their plantation – which sends Angus Shubert into fits of rage whenever he comes into contact with her. Jedediah Reed is a preacher who comes to the plantation to bring his faith to the slaves. Selah begins to get close to Jedediah, until she is in serious danger, and he just feels so helpless that he decides to cool their friendship.

This is another book of fast moving, exciting happenings on a sugar plantation in the 1770's.
