

"We are reducing the death of moms and babies through education and support," said Mary Samuel, reflecting on the work of the PWS&Dsupported Village Safe Motherhood Committee in her community. This request shocks Mitch because he has not been faithful in his attendance at the Synagogue – and doesn't really feel like he knows Albert Lewis well enough to talk at his funeral, but after taking a few days to think things over he agrees And thus starts a long friendship with regular visits by Mitch.

Henry Covington is a Christian pastor with a very controversial background. Henry grew up rough and carried on his 'in-and-out' of prison life until he finds his faith and changes his ways. Henry ministers in a church with a leaky roof and very little heating, but he ministers to people who really need to hear about a loving God, and who need a good hot meal each day.

This is a very interesting read and leaves you with a good feeling that there are definitely a lot of "good" people in this world. If you haven't read **Tuesdays With Morrie**, by Mitch Albom - maybe think about reading it before this book. They are not a series, but Mitch Albom refers to his earlier book in this newer one.
