

After the Taliban took control of Afghanistan, the family fled to Pakistan. While they were able to find refuge in a cramped one-bedroom house, Samagneh's father couldn't find work. and the family had very little access to financial resources. Through Presbyterian World Service & Development, in collaboration with ACT Alliance, Samagneh's family received cash assistance to help with purchasing **essential** items. Samaaneh's father has used some of the money to arrange for his daughter to have physiotherapy as well.
