When Thoko's husband left her to care for their six children alone, she felt like she was sinking. Thoko bought farming supplies to grow more food. After selling the produce she harvested. Thoko began earning enough to pay school fees for her children. Soon, she could afford supplies to repair the roof of her home and was also able to purchase a goat and pig, which will be an additional source of income. Today, little trace of that hopelessness is left. Thoko feels empowered and it all began with a loan.
