The story starts in the United States, and Jakob tries to bring a lawsuit that would hopefully bring some closure to the Neumann family. Hana is brought in as cocounsel, and decides that they need to do some research in Israel to get more insight into whether this was really a terrorist attack or just an unfortunate case of someone in the wrong place at the wrong time. UPDATE FROM REV. JOHN:

Thursday, February 27: What a full, tiring, and uplifting day of field visits along with a meeting with the Embangweni Hospital staff. We also had a tour of the hospital during the morning. Things are pretty basic here and the dirt/mud roads are rough. The 10 of us were in a large SUV for at least 2 hours driving to and from the rural medical clinics. The heavy rains earlier in the week left the roads in bad shape. The local village leaders and young people put on an almost two hour program of drama, music and testimonials having to do with HIV/AIDS prevention, family planning and maternal and infant health care. It was entertaining, informative and educational. The people of the villages are so grateful for our visits and the life changing work the church is doing through PWS&D.
