The First Word (Luke 23:33-34)

When they came to the place called "The Skull", they nailed Jesus to the cross there, and the two criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Jesus said, "Forgive them, Father! They do not know what they are doing."

The Second Word (Luke 23:39-43)

One of the criminals hanging there threw insults at him:

"Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" The other one, however, rebuked him, saying: "Don't you fear God? Here we are all under the same sentence. Ours, however, is only right, for we are getting what we deserve for what we did; but he has done no wrong." And he said to Jesus, "Remember me, Jesus, when you come as King!" Jesus said to him, "I tell you this: today you will be in Paradise with me."

The Third Word (John 19:25-27)

And from that time the disciple took her to live in his home.
