

Update from the Interim Moderator

The Session met on Tuesday September 20th via zoom. The Session was pleased to receive such a positive report from the Presbytery of London. One of the main focuses of the meeting on Tuesday evening was discussing the Search Committee. The elders are taking a few days to pray and consider this important role for the church. It is anticipated by early October the Search Committee will be formed and then will commence their work. One of the first tasks of the Search Committee will be seeking input from the congregation! Stay tuned! The Session agreed that a combination of stability in the pulpit coupled with some new voices would be a good balance for worship leadership during this time of reflection and discernment. We are arateful that Rev. Michael Stol will be with us most Sundays. On the Sundays when Rev. Stol is not with us, we will be hearing preachers of various ages and backgrounds. This variety in the pulpit is useful for us as we prepare for a new minister. Likewise, various elders and/or members will be taking turns sharing the announcements on Sunday mornings. The Session felt this was an opportunity for the congregation to hear different voices and perhaps connect some names and faces!
