

We lift up to you those whose lives have been disrupted, shattered, with broken bodies and bruised minds. Life will not be the same yet may they, like Jacob, find new life even as they limp forevermore.

We lift up to you those who were there first. The passersby, the lunch mates untouched, the strangers standing nearby who first witnessed the horror. We lift up to you EMS personnel, the vanguard of those rebuilding lives. And we lift up to you the police, 32 Division who responded first among many; we honour the officer who disarmed the attacker with the power of words and conviction. May they all be healed of their own wounds from today.

Finally, we pray for the man. The man who drove the truck and took those lives. May your Holy Spirit convict him so that he may repent, and in so turning to you find new life.

In 2015, THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION COMMISSION OF CANADA (TRC) announced 94 Cals to Action upon concluding six years of receiving testimonies from residential school survivors. These Calls to Action are for churches, governments, businesses, and all parts of Canadian society to address the history and legacy of residential schools. The 1994 General Assembly of The

Presbyterian Church in Canada adopted a Confession to God and Indigenous people for ht harm it caused while operating eleven residential schools (two after 1925).

Reconciliation is a priority for the church, and the Calls to Action provide concrete recommendations of how the church can live into this commitment.
