#### Meet Rev. Andrew Thompson!

The Search Committee and Session are delighted to introduce the congregation to Rev. Andrew Thompson, as the candidate who is preaching for the call to be the new minister at Chalmers!

Andrew obtained his Bachelor of Arts from Tyndale University and Seminary, his Bachelor of Theology from McGill and his Master of Divinity from Presbyterian College in Montreal. He was ordained within the Presbyterian Church in Canada, and has served as Minister at Atwood Presbyterian Church in Atwood (2011-2015) and at Knox St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Dutton (2015-present). Andrew also serves as the 31 Combat Engineer Regiment, St. Thomas and Waterloo, ON Reserve Canadian Armed Forces Chaplain since 2016. He was the chaplain for the Dutton Fire Department from 2016-2019, and served as the Moderator of the Presbytery of London in 2021-2022.

Andrew is married to Sarah, and together they have a busy household with four children ranging in age from 2-13 years. In his spare time (does he have spare time?), Andrew enjoys woodworking and playing guitar.

The search committee was struck by Rev. Andrew Thompson's thoughtful application, his sincere and dynamic presence in the pulpit and his reflective presence.

As he noted in his application, Andrew has a passion for Christian community and seeks "to inspire the faith community by engaging in outreach". He has a heart to walk alongside God's people through times of joy and sadness.

The Search committee and Session extend a warm welcome to Andrew today and are excited to recommend him to be the next minister at Chalmers.

## The minister has preached for the call...what happens now?

The process of calling a minister in the Presbyterian Church in Canada is deeply rooted in the belief that God calls us – not just as individuals – but through the community of faith. Before a candidate is invited to preach for the call, written applications are reviewed, interviews are conducted and the search committee spends time in prayer. The candidate's application is then reviewed and approved by the Session before the "call weekend."

Following the service today, all members and adherents are invited to stay in the sanctuary for a congregational meeting, led by the interim moderator, Rev. Mavis Currie. The name of the candidate will be brought forward and the congregation will vote. If the vote is in the affirmative, every member and adherent will be invited to sign the call—this will be done in the narthex.

The call is then presented to the Presbytery of London for review and approval. The presbytery will ensure that the call is in good order and that the call is strongly supported with the signatures of most members and adherents. Then the call is placed in the hands of the candidate for their acceptance.

Near the beginning of the candidate's ministry, a special service will be held to celebrate this new chapter in the congregation's life. This service is called an Induction Service. Members of presbytery attend, and it is a time for worship, thanksgiving and celebration!
