Exit Review Meetings

With Rev. John's retirement scheduled for September 1, 2022, a series of exit interview meetings are planned with Rev. Keith McKee and Presbytery Committee. These will be in-person meetings here at Chalmers the evening of **Tuesday, August 23**, between 6:30 and 8:45 pm and will include a time for congregational discussion. **Members of the congregation are invited to meet with Rev. McKee between 8 and 8:45 pm.**



August 21: When the Taliban took control of Afghanistan in August 2021, an atmosphere of uncertainty prevailed. Among the many issues that have surfaced since the Taliban takeover are rapidly spreading hunger and restrictions to education. International sanctions on the Taliban make it challenging to provide assistance in Afghanistan. When possible, Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D) provides emergency food assistance with the support of other members of Canadian Foodgrains Bank. PWS&D's partner in Afghanistan has also established 12 education centres to safely support students while restrictions on education are in place.

As the future for people in Afghanistan remains uncertain under Taliban control, we pray that God grants them the strength to get through this difficult period.

This story takes place in 1881 when "mail-order brides" were something that seemed like a good idea. Marriages would be arranged by mail, and the bride and groom would meet for the first time when the bride arrived in her new town.

Eliza Cantrell is just such a bride-to-be, and is on her way by train to meet her intended husband when the train is robbed. A group of men come through the carriages and demand money, jewellery and anything of value from the passengers. Eliza has her inheritance with her as a start in her new life, and she tries to hide it from the robbers. But the thief who is standing by her seat notices her attempt to hide the money and he not only takes it, but he pistol whips her across the face and neck, cutting her quite badly. When they train finally arrives in Salt Flatts, Eliza has no money, is seriously hurt, and her future husband is not even in town.

This is an interesting story that takes place in a time long past. I thoroughly enjoyed it.


