From the Editor

Anyone who knows me, knows that I am a huge advocate for children & youth. I believe that children and youth are much more capable than we give them credit for and I believe that children & youth will live up to the expectations you set for them. Even so, I was blown away by some children this past month.

The school that Torry & Isla attend has a new principal this year. He has been making some great improvements to the school and doing a great job of getting parents involved and positive about their children's education. He has the whole school focus on a character trait each month and then holds an assembly at the end of the month to recognize all of the students who have exemplified that trait. In September then focused on respect, and I attended the assembly at the beginning of October to see many students receive the certificate for respect. In October they focused on kindness and so at the beginning of November I returned to see those certificates presented.

So by November 11th, I had already attended two assemblies at my daughters' school. The assemblies had been fun and respectful, but what I would typically expect behavior-wise from a couple of hundred children.

So on Remembrance Day, the new principal again invited parents to join the school for a special assembly and I again attended, knowing what the previous two assemblies had been like. Boy, was I in for a surprise! The entire assembly, including children from Junior Kindergarten (3&4 years old) up to grade 8s, was done in complete silent in a slightly dim gymnasium. The teacher who had coordinated the program, led the assembly with a PowerPoint presentation. When the slide came up that was the image connected to each reading, the student doing the reading simply stood up, did their part and sat back down. There was no master of ceremonies, there were no instructions, there was no guidance. The whole school was involved and not a single teacher moved throughout the entire assembly. At the end of the assembly, the entire school stood, in silence, and placed their poppies on the cross as they exited the gym.

I was in complete and utter disbelief. I think I set pretty high standards for what I expect children to be capable of, but I was blown away. I decided that this new principal must be some kind of superhero to be able to get all of these children to sit so quietly and be so respectful for so long. So I did what I do when something surprises or pleases me—I shared it on Facebook. And then I was even more surprised! I had several other friends post back that they had experienced the exact same thing at their schools! This was not a singular experience and although I still give much of the credit to our new principal and the new climate that he has brought to our school, he is not the only principal capable of this.

So even I, who always believes that kids are capable of great things, was reminded again that children (and youth) will indeed live up to the expectations set for them, no matter how high (or low) we set them. If you want children to be awesome, give them clear criteria for how to "be awesome" and then expect them to achieve it. You'll be amazed!

Intergenerational Worship

We've all heard "Children and youth are the future of our church." We've probably also all heard, "They're not just the future, they're the present". I've heard these expressions so many times and for so many years now that they've started to lose meaning. They've become just trite statements people make when they want to show how important children and youth ministry is.

But let's pause and think about it for a moment. It's true, isn't it, that those who are children and youth today are indeed the future of the church. If they don't grow up to see the value of attending worship Sunday by Sunday, there will be no Church (and I don't just mean the physical building of Chalmers) twenty years from now. Never before has this been so real. Mainline churches (like Chalmers) are losing our children and youth at an astounding rate and they're not coming back as adults. If we don't do something to change this course, the church really will be gone in the near future.

Personally, this idea terrifies me. But, it also should excite us. Now is the time for change. Now is the time to embrace new ideas. And Chalmers has been doing that! Chalmers has been looking the future in the eye and saying, "We want to be a part of that!" I'm constantly thrilled to tell other Presbyterians what we're doing at Chalmers and seeing their looks of interest and intrigue. People are surprised to hear some of the things we've done and how our congregation has embraced new ideas.

Members of the Worship Committee, Christian Education & Faith Development Committee and the Youth Ministry Team have been meeting for several months to look at ways that we can help include children and youth in worship. We have read study after study and heard presentation after presentation about how having children and youth in worship and involved in worship is key to having them become worshipping adults. In the bulletin throughout December and January, we will be sharing some of this research with you so that we can all learn, as a congregation, how important this is.

The group that has been meeting also believes that Sunday School is a valuable experience for children. It is a place where they can learn about God's word with peers their own age and in ways that are age appropriate. They can explore God's word in active, creative ways and ask questions as they arise. This is not possible during a typical sermon.

We are exploring ways that allow children to become more included in worship, but also maintain that special time devoted to learning as children. As a trial, starting January 11th, we are going to invite the children back into worship after the sermon so that they can be part of worship at the beginning when we approach God together, then they can listen to God's word and explore it in Sunday School, and then they can return to worship for the last few minutes as we respond to God together as a whole Christian family.

Change can always be tricky and even uncomfortable at first, but we are hopeful that as we learn together as a congregation to embrace children in worship, this small adjustment will make a big difference in the lives of our children and in the future of our church.
