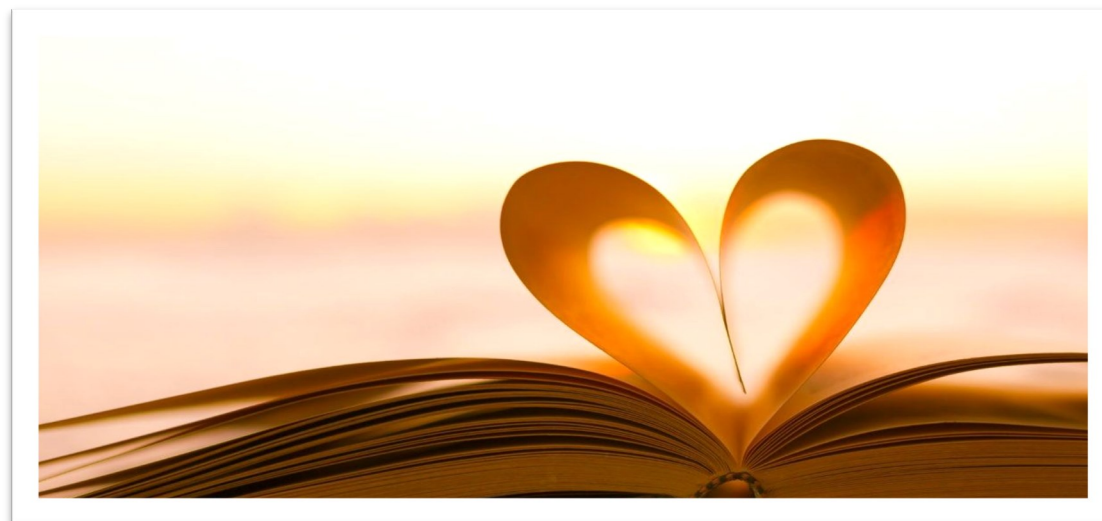

Today, Wilner has a beautiful garden with diverse crops, such as corn, pigeon peas, yam, taro, squash, okra, spinach, and forest and fruit trees. This has helped Wilner afford to pay the school fees for his four children and support his family's other needs as well. This sustainable agriculture project is supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development in collaboration with Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

2021 Year End Financial Snapshot

A surplus year-to-date of \$ 6,143 is wonderful, although the reader must consider the value when compared to the planned budget. The "Canada Helps Donations" route performed some \$ 10,000 above plan, with the wage subsidy program and presbytery assistance helping considerably. Expenses were quite reasonable, although restricted by current pandemic conditions. Please uphold your congregation's financial picture in your prayers.

2021 Annual Report -please have your submissions emailed to the church office by January 21st.

Due to the **Omicron Variant** and the increasing number of people being infected, both in the province and in the city, the Task Force met on December 27th to discuss worship services at Chalmers. This variant is extremely contagious and we feel that in-person worship services are not the best option at this time.

The Session of Chalmers' Presbyterian Church met on December 29, 2021 and approved the following change to worship services: **That as of January 2, 2022, in-person worship would cease and worship services would be live-streamed.**

This is to be reviewed at the January 18, 2022 Session meeting.

We are hopeful that this will be short term, but will be reviewed monthly by Session.

Monday Night Bible Study on The Lord's Prayer

on Zoom, starting on January 31st and concluding on February 28th

When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, Jesus gave them this prayer. He likely taught it to his followers often, not just one time. He never intended The Lord's Prayer to be a museum piece, framed and placed on a mantel or in a display case. It was Jesus teaching God's people, through his disciples, how to pray.

In ***The Lord's Prayer: The Meaning and Power of the Prayer Jesus Taught***, pastor and bestselling author Adam Hamilton guides us to really know and really pray The Lord's Prayer. He explores each of its rich lines and their meaning in the Bible, illuminating what we ask of God and what we ask of ourselves through its words. And he teaches us how to use it as a pattern for our own prayer life.
