Sunday of June. Both of these are great opportunities to "reach out" and invite someone to come along.

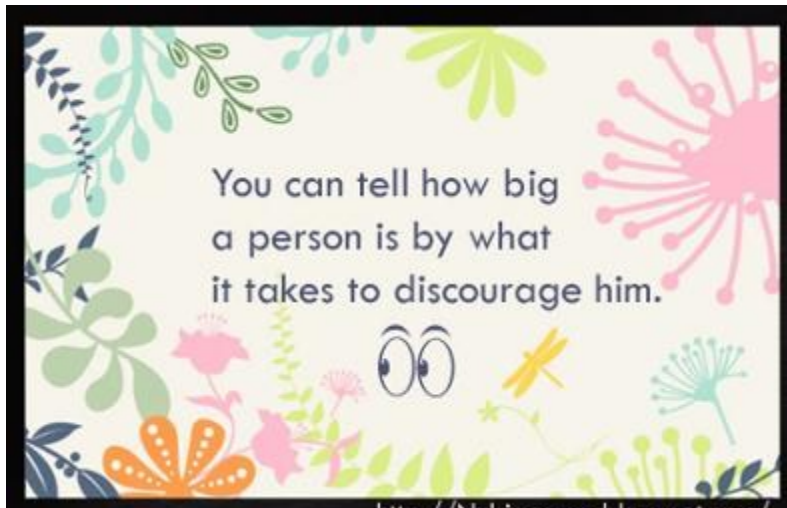

Over the past few weeks, members and adherents of Chalmers have been asked to fill out a survey about their thoughts and feelings on the Two Service Format at Chalmers. Those surveys were all due back by yesterday, so over the next few weeks the Worship Committee and Session will be coming to a decision about what worship at Chalmers will look like starting in the Fall.

I want to take this opportunity (nicely balanced between surveys being submitted but results not being known) to thank the many, many people who have been involved in the journey that we have been on together over the past few years. The introduction of a second service at Chalmers has had a profound and lasting effect on all of us, regardless of whether two services continue and regardless of whether you have ever attended the second service.

There has been a small(ish) team of people who have put A LOT of effort into this for the past three/four years and also larger team of people who have been committed to make it the best possible experience. I can only imagine the endless hours that have been put in behind the scenes, and I want to say thank you, even on behalf of the people who have never attended.

If the church tries to cling to the past and remain unchanged, we are lost. The church in Canada is declining and keeping our feet firmly cemented in what once was will only ensure that we decline with it. Whether we continue with two services or not, the addition of that

second service for the past few years has forced Chalmers to examine many things about ourselves, and I don't believe that there is any way we could now return to one service as it was three years ago or even one year ago. The most obvious example of this is the introduction of

the screens into the sanctuary. Having the second service gave us the incentive to go to the cost and effort of installing projection screens. Over the past year, the only complaint I have heard about them (personally) is that they're not used enough at the 10:30 service! That certainly does not sound to me like a congregation cemented in the past! We now have a beautiful audio/visual booth at the back of the sanctuary that allows us to incorporate all types of music, musical instruments and mikes for dramas with much greater effectiveness.

Regardless of what happens in the Fall, we have these two large physical reminders of our willingness to move forward as a congregation, and it would be ludicrous (in my humble opinion) to switch to one service but refuse to enjoy any of these additions simply because they were installed for a different service. But more than the physical additions, I think the two services have

introduced a new vibrancy to Chalmers. I can feel a new attitude amongst people. It has forced us to really question what is important, what is worship, what is church. Not knowing what the results of the surveys are going to be, I still think that it has been and continues to be so important for us to really look carefully at what it all means to us. It's too easy to just take church for granted and for it to remain as it always has. It's too easy to expect church not to change because we're comfortable, but before long, we'll be comfortable and alone!

I have the wonderful opportunity to speak with people from other churches on a regular basis, and what I hear over and over again is how blessed Chalmers is to be open to new ideas, and willing to change. Sometimes from the inside, we don't feel open-minded, but compared to many other churches we have an amazing congregation who are willing to try new things!

Chalmers is a vibrant community. But in order to be vibrant, we must be open to change. We must not get lulled into comfort. Communities need compromise, because no one person can get everything his or her way. So as we look to the fall, and whatever that holds, I'm asking, begging, pleading with everyone at Chalmers to keep an open mind (and yes, that goes for me too!!!) No matter what happens, I can guarantee you one thing—there will be change. And if there isn't, we should be worried!

Chalmers has entered the world of Facebook with a “group” and a “page”. It has taken me a while to figure out what the difference is between a Facebook page and a Facebook group, but I think I’ve got it now. A group can be kept private so that only those invited to join can post and read what is posted. A page is open to all. Both of these have a real value to Chalmers.

The **Chalmers’ Group** is for members and adherents of Chalmers. This is a place where upcoming events can be posted and discussed. Think of it as a church bulletin board. There is a relative sense of privacy (as much as one can trust on the internet) since everyone who joins this

group must be added by one of the administrators. This group already has over 50 members. If you are on Facebook and would like to receive updates from Chalmers, please let me know and I will add you to the group.

The **Chalmers’ Page** is more intended for the general public. Think of this as an advertisement. Anyone on Facebook can see this page. We will use this page to post information about worship and community events at Chalmers. Members of Chalmers are still most welcome to “like” this page. In fact, to do so would be a form of evangelism because the more people who “like” our page, the more it will spread



around Facebook. This page already has 20 “likes”.

Obviously, there are some events which will fit in both locations (like Reach Out singing on June 3rd) and so those who are both members of the Group and have liked the page, will receive a double reminder, but I will try to keep these to a minimum!

So please “Like us on Facebook” or join our group—just another way that we can all keep up-to-date on life at Chalmers!

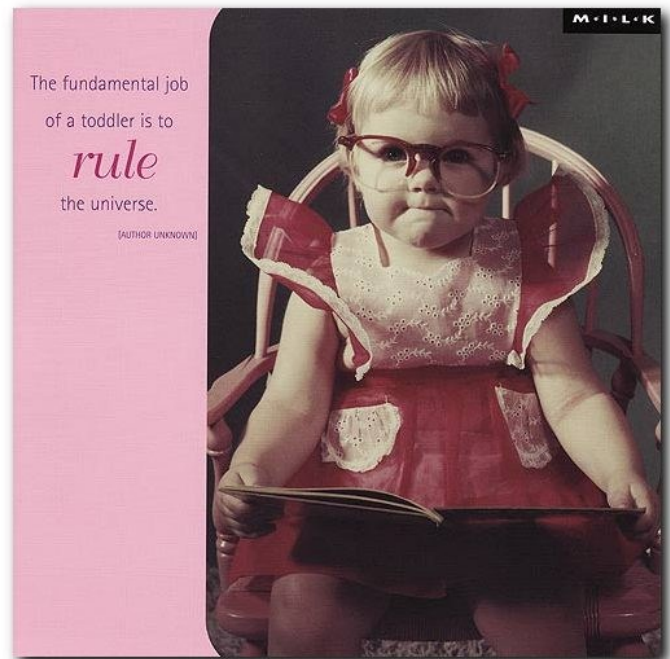
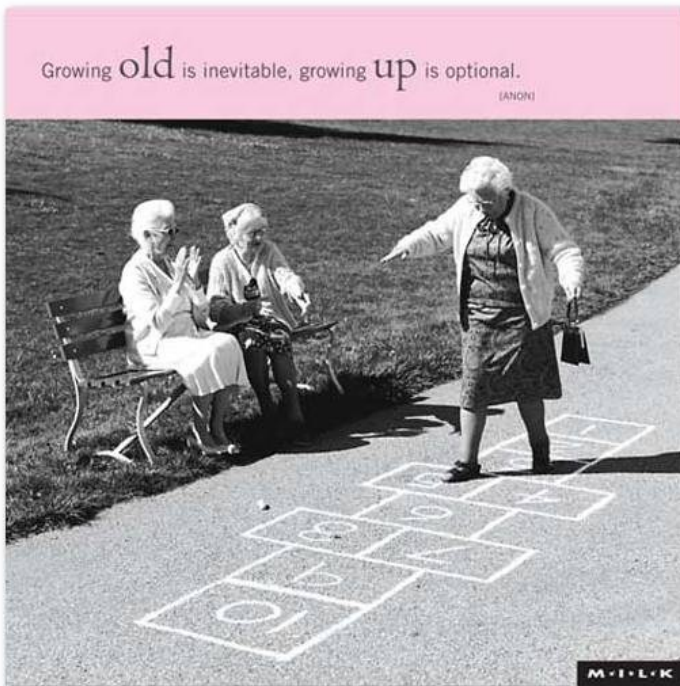
