

Marching Through Lent

Lent is the period of forty days (excluding Sundays) that lead up to Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, the day after Shove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday has come to be associated with pancakes, as it was originally the time when households used up their rich foods (like eggs, sugar, and milk) before the Lenten period of fasting. The term Mardi Gras is actually French for Fat Tuesday, also referring to the time to use up special foods. In Sunday School this month, students will be involved in "Moving with Passion". This is a series of lessons on different aspects of the Easter season. Each Sunday will have a different focus:

March 1: Movie & Popcorn—The Easter Story

March 8: Food Day—Taste the Last Supper

March 15: Craft Day— Easter Symbol Creations

March 22: Games Day— Easter Freeze Frames

March 29: Live Drama— Moving with Passion
