65-year-old Ruqaiya lives in Afghanistan. Her life took a challenging turn ten years ago when she fell on ice, resulting in partial paralysis. Now unable to weave, she and her family face significant financial hardship, made worse by the political and economic situation in the country. Unyielding Hope - by Janet Oke

When Hope Calls - Book One

This is a brand-new series in our library – and, having just finished reading Book! – I recommend it to anyone who likes stories of children.

The story takes place around 1880 – when the Industrial Revolution left many families in dire straits. The children were the ones who suffered the most – and many were sent off to other countries that were part of the British Empire. The idea was that they would be adopted into families there and become part of that family – a family who had the means to give them a better life.

This story starts with Lillian Walsh, a young child whose mother, father and sister have all passed – and Lillian is adopted by a Canadian couple. She is a happy child, and her parents adore her. But then her adoptive mom dies, and Lilian is left to struggle with her feeling of abandonment, and questions about why God would allowed so many bad things to happens to her. She gets a notice that she has been left a bit of an inheritance and that her sister is likely still alive.

That's as much as I can tell you without spoiling the story too much. But I enjoyed it very much - and have just started reading the 2^{nd} book entitled Sustaining Faith. These books will be on the "New Book" shelf in the library.
