### May 17: Paying it forward in Ghana

Due to the loss of his leg from an infection at the age of thirteen, Halidu Dayuma thought he would never be financially stable. Some simple pieces of thread and the caring support of Garu Community Based Rehabilitation Centre in Ghana changed everything. At this PWS&D-supported centre, which is committed to improving the quality of life for people with disabilities, Halidu learned cloth weaving and dressmaking so that he could make an income. Inspired by his studies with skilled coaches, Halidu is now paying it forward by training more than 40 apprentices to continue the work he loves. In gratitude, Halidu reflected, "I am who I am today because of your generous work and love."

Robert Whitlow writes about lawyers and court cases, but although this story centres around two lawyers, the court case never actually happens. Hana Abboud and Jacob Brodsky are the lawyers, and the case circles around a terrorist attack 4 years ago which killed a young mother Gloria Neumann and injured her daughter Sadie. The story starts in the United States, and Jakob tries to bring a lawsuit that would hopefully bring some closure to the Neumann family. Hana is brought in as co-counsel, and decides that they need to do some research in Israel to get more insight into whether this was really a terrorist attack or just an unfortunate case of someone in the wrong place at the wrong time. I found this an interesting read, with many twists and turns that kept you reading 'just another page' consistently.
