"We serve, Jesus heals" is the motto of Tansen Mission Hospital in western Nepal, which serves a population of one million. As part of the Tansen Hospital medical and surgical team, made up of Nepali and international physicians, Nick responds to referrals for gynecology, urology, and abdominal problems.
