We waited, some patiently, others irritated because nature messed up their hurried day.

I am always mesmerized by rainfall. I got lost in the sound and sight of the heavens washing away the dirt and dust of the world. Memories of running, splashing so carefree as a child came pouring in as a welcome reprieve from the worries of my day.

Her little voice was so sweet as it broke the hypnotic trance we were all caught in, 'Mom let's run through the rain,' she said.

'Let's run through the rain!' She repeated.

'No, honey. We'll wait until it slows down a bit,' Mom replied.

This young child waited a minute and repeated: 'Mom, let's run through the rain..'

'No, we won't, Mom. That's not what you said this morning,' the young girl said as she tugged at her Mom's arm.

'This morning? When did I say we could run through the rain and not get wet?'

The entire crowd stopped dead silent.. I swear you couldn't hear anything but the rain.. We all stood silently. No one left. Mom paused and thought for a moment about what she would say.



My Time in China by Sydney LeTissier

Throughout my grade 8 year I was involved in my school's Me to We club. The various fundraisers we held and events we organized inspired me to take things to the next level and go to China on a Me to We volunteer trip.

I left Canada on July 6th with 28 other young people from all over Canada and the US. After a 14 hour flight we finally landed in Beijing and met with 4 teens from China who were going to be joining our volunteer group.

The first week of our trip was all of the fun stuff, we visited all the popular tourist sites in Beijing and got used to the new environment. Everyone adjusted at a different pace. Some became comfortable right away, while others took a full week to become accustom to the exotic food, the lack of familiar faces, and of course, the squatter toilets!

I personally, fell in love with the country, the culture, and the people immediately. You seemed to form a connection with the people immediately, the language barrier was forgotten as you communicated through broken English and lots of hand signals. Everywhere you went, the people would ask you for pictures, or simply stop to talk.

About a week into the trip we had our first volunteer experience. We went to teach English at a primary school in a community called Gufopu. Gufopu was a big change from Beijing, dirt roads, tiny houses, lots of dogs and donkeys on the streets. The people were just as kind though, and welcomed us with open arms.

The kids where amazing. They were malnourished and many of them wore the same clothes for days, but they were happy. Overall, they were just kids. They joked in class, loved to play, and could make a game out of anything! I don't know how much English they actually learned because we couldn't get them to sit still!

Our second volunteer experience was going to a new community and digging trenches for the foundation of a primary school. We worked there for 4 days, digging for 5 hours a day. Just like the other community, the people were amazing!

Then we flew out to a small city near the Shaolin Temple. We toured the temple, learned some meditation and kung fu, and even got to share a silent meal with the monks.

Our final volunteering experience was my favourite, we taught English at the Shaolin Orphanage. The kids at the orphanage were much more obedient than the ones at Gufopu, but they still shared the same love of mischief. Teaching them was defiantly memorable. Most of the kids in the class I taught were my own age, so teaching them was more like sharing knowledge with friends. Saying goodbye to the kids at the orphanage was the hardest part of the trip.

Coming home was also difficult. I was around the same 32 people for 3 weeks, and then suddenly they were gone. It was weird hearing people speak English, and eating western food, I basically had to completely re-adjust to the western lifestyle.

After going on a trip like that, it is impossible to just continue on with your life like nothing happened, I have become inspired to make a difference!

What a difference this friendship makes in the lives of both Adeline and Grace – and then it spreads to all those around, even to the snooty poodle names Penelope!

Yes a lovely story, with a lovely moral attached. I hope you enjoy this book I certainly did!

But some folks in the community would like to see Amelia sell her farm and go to live in a retirement residence. Amelia is not ready for that yet, and Max feels that she can help this friend work her lavender farm, sell her goods and well they could really help each other. Read about Jessie's fight to get her health back, Max's fight to build a new life for herself and Amelia's fight just to stay in her home, stay safe and do the things that she so enjoys doing.
